

MS Midnatsol provides Discovery Style Voyages suited for people with a true spirit of exploration, but with less emphasis on the rigors of an 'expedition'. Put into service on April 15, 2003, and with an ice class 1X rating and advanced technology, she is very well-suited for our newest itineraries in Antarctica in 2016 – 2017.

### A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

MS Midnatsol (Midnight Sun) is named after the Norwegian summer. The interior's bright, colorful décor is inspired by the warm, sunny climate, and is a great contrast to the ice and snow in Antarctica.

### ENVIRONMENTALLY-SOUND AND MODERN

The ship has a strong environmental profile and a modern design, with Norwegian materials used extensively throughout its interiors and Norwegian art on display. What characterizes MS Midnatsol is the large, two-story panorama lounge above the bow and the large glass expanses that allow natural light to enter as well as provide extraordinary views. There are also 23 beautifully appointed suites, some of which have balconies.

### EXPLORER DECK & MEDIA ROOM

Our explorer deck is where you can meet fellow adventurers for scientific fun with our engaging Discovery Team, no matter your age. The Media Room on board shows the highlights of the day. 



# FAMOUS 'FIRSTS' UNDER THE NORWEGIAN FLAG

Sailing under the Norwegian flag carries a lot of significant maritime history. In the heroic age of exploration (around the turn of the 20th century), man's desire to map the globe and the pursuit of science drove the race to unveil the planet's last 'terra incognita'. The polar ship Fram and explorer Fridtjof Nansen left Norway for an expedition to the North Pole in 1893. The same year, Captain Richard With established a regular steamship service linking northern and southern Norway – Hurtigruten.

The original Fram was the most famous vessel of its time, and the achievements of her expeditions are unparalleled: With Fridtjof Nansen, she was the first ship to sail across the Arctic Ocean. Then Otto Sverdrup used her to survey a larger area than any previous expedition – the Canadian territory of Nunavut. Most famous of all, she took Roald Amundsen to his starting point in Antarctica, as he raced to reach the South Pole.

In 1896 Hurtigruten started the 'Sports Route' from Hammerfest to Spitsbergen with DS Lofoten. The captain on board was Otto Sverdrup, who just came home after an expedition in the Arctic Ocean. The same year Richard With built a hotel near Longyearbyen on Spitsbergen.

In 1969, Hurtigruten set up an express route to Spitsbergen in the summer

months, and 2002 was Hurtigruten's first season in Antarctica.

Hurtigruten had its first season in Greenland with its new explorer ship MS Fram in 2007. The ship was named after the polar ship Fram. In 2008, MS Fram passed both the northern and the southern polar circles.

Today, more than 120 years later, Hurtigruten's explorer ships take guests to Antarctica, Spitsbergen, Greenland, Iceland, and Europe. Our ships travel in the wake of these great explorers. The original Fram was a vessel for broadening the understanding of the world – let our explorer ships be the same for you!



## WATER-LEVEL DECK VS. TOP-DECK DEPLOYMENT

Other expedition operators make the best of the complications of top-deck Zodiac deployment with cranes to lower them to the water level. Consequently, their top decks are used primarily as working space. MS Midnatsol deploys landing craft from a unique, water-level deck resulting in a top-deck that is free for you to use - the most popular observation point on the ship.

Hurtigruten, along with fellow ocean advocates like Mr. Pugh, seek to enhance awareness and contribute our knowledge and years of experience to protect the vulnerable nature and unique culture in the polar areas.



**Maritime Lawyer/  
Pioneer Swimmer**

He is best known for undertaking the first swim across the North Pole in 2007 to highlight the melting of the Arctic sea ice. In 2010 he swam across a glacial lake on Mount Everest to draw attention to the melting of the glaciers in the Himalayas, and the impact the reduced water supply will have on world peace. And in 2014 he became the first person to complete a long distance swim in all Seven Seas, a campaign he undertook to urge surrounding nations to create more maritime protected areas (MPAs).

Olav has led numerous scientific expeditions in Antarctica and with a PhD from Ohio State University, he has more accomplishments than we can list, including 4 decades with the Norwegian Polar Institute, the Research Counsel of Norway, and Norway's permanent station in Antarctica. He is regarded as one of the world's leading glaciologists. He was also the initiator of the Norwegian Glacier Museum in Fjærland and the visitor's center; Polaria, adjacent to Norwegian Polar Institute in Tromsø.

Monica is in some ways the most remarkable member of your 'Discovery Team'. If you feel like getting both the highlights of the South American coast and Antarctica – this is your adventure! Starting in Montevideo, we continue to the UNESCO World Heritage Site Peninsula Valdés. And then, on to Antarctica! We spend four days here, seeing the highlights of this polar region. Then we enjoy Cape Horn and the wild fjords of Chile before ending the voyage in Punta Arenas. Our extensive onboard program, excursions, and activities make this a dream voyage for any adventurer looking for an extra-special holiday.



## DAY 1 – 5: PATAGONIA, ARGENTINA

Your adventure starts with an overnight in Uruguay's capital, Montevideo. Before you embark MS Midnatsol the next day you can learn more about this exciting and welcoming city by joining a city tour. When we spend a day at sea you get to know your fellow adventurers, having fun in the Explorer Room or just enjoying the views from deck. You can look forward to our one and half day stay in the Valdés region, one of the wildlife highlights of Argentina where you get to see some of the largest marine animals in their natural

environment. We will also pay a visit to the amazing Puerto Madryn. Join excursions such as whale watching, a walk on the beach with the penguins, or a hike in the wonderful surroundings.

## DAY 6 – 9: FALKLAND ISLANDS

As we sail to the Falkland Islands, there will be several lectures on popular science topics, and we start our Young Explorers Antarctica program. Grown-up explorers can enjoy an Argentinean wine tasting in the evening. New Island is a tiny little isle in the Falkland Islands. You should

never judge an island by its size though – the wildlife here includes fur seals, rockhopper penguins, Falkland steamer ducks, southern elephant seals, and South American sea lions. Carcass Island is covered with white sandy beaches, colorful hilltops, and is also a haven for small birds. We use small boats to go ashore for exploring, hiking, or birdwatching safaris. In the evening we invite everybody to the lounge to recap the highlights from the last couple of days. Stanley, the capital of the Falklands, is a colorful seaside town that boasts many reminders of its British heritage, such as red

**DAY 10: AT SEA**



**DAY 11 – 14: ANTARCTICA**

Now you are in one of the most remote areas in the world! We will visit research stations, places that were used in the old whaling days, landings with great surroundings, and have theme days on board. Come ashore and join our Expedition Team on hikes; see the penguins, seals, and maybe even whales up close; enjoy field days that include kayaking, snorkeling, and exploring the waters and ice in small boats. **DAY 15 – 18: CAPE HORN & CHILEAN FJORDS**

As we leave Antarctica and head back north, we spend the day recapping all our experiences at sea. Of all mythical places on Earth, Cape Horn is high on the list. Before the Panama Canal, seafarers had to pass this infamous rocky island in order to cross from one side of the Americas to the other. We will do our best to make a landing on Cape Horn – however, this is an area known for high seas and challenging conditions. As we set course for Punta Arenas, we sail through some of the world’s wildest and most-impressive nature. The Chilean fjords are deep, with high mountains and glaciers that calve in the sea. Enjoy the amazing views from deck, or come ashore to explore the area like Darwin did more than 180 years ago. Sadly, every adventure must come to an end. It is time to say goodbye to all your new friends and the crew when we reach Punta Arenas, on the edge of the Strait of Magellan. Your journey home continues with our flight to Santiago de Chile.



## YOUR EXPEDITION DAY BY DAY

### DAY 1 – 5: PATAGONIA, CHILEAN FJORDS, AND CAPE HORN

Welcome to Chile and your adventure, starting with an overnight stay in Santiago de Chile. The following day you will fly to Punta Arenas, where your expedition ship is already awaiting you. Once on board MS Midnatsol we kick off the voyage with a welcome on board dinner. The first highlight is Isla Tucker, a small island famous for its colony of Magellanic penguins, birds, dolphins, and sea lions. As we make our way south we sail through the extremely narrow Gabriel Canal with enormous mountains on each side. Then it's time to get ready for an exciting time when we explore the Chilean fjords, Garibaldi Fjord being one of them. When we enter the last part of this fjord you're in for a beautiful surprise: the Garibaldi Glaciers. The mountains and valleys are steep and even if there is snow on top of the mountains the area is very green with abundant wildlife. Come ashore and maybe we will see sea lions, Andean condors,

and several other birds only found here. There will be an Argentinean wine-tasting in the evening. You might also have an opportunity to go ashore on Cape Horn.

### DAY 6: AT SEA

As we cross the Drake Passage on our way to Antarctica we continue our Young Explorers Antarctica program. The Explorer Room is buzzing with activity with several lectures about popular science topics. There is a tango course in the afternoon.

### DAY 7 – 11: ANTARCTICA

Come ashore to explore the impressive Antarctic scenery, penguins, and fur seals. From deck there are lots of chances to see whales as well. Enjoy close encounters with wildlife and glaciers and whaling stations and its relics.

### DAY 12: AT SEA

After an exhilarating time in Antarctica, you can spend the day in the Explorer Room at

lectures, on deck, or seeing a recap of our experiences so far.



# LANDINGS AND EXCURSIONS WITH MS MIDNATSOL

On these voyages the elements rule, and the weather, wind, and ice conditions will determine our schedule. These are some of the possible landing sites, excursions, and activities in Antarctica, depending on your voyage.

## PATAGONIA, CAPE HORN, AND CHILEAN FJORDS

### CHILE

#### Punta Arenas

Punta Arenas is the capital of the Magellan region. With over 130,000 inhabitants, it is the largest town in the region. The town was founded in the mid-1800s and grew into a center for seafaring, trade, and culture, spreading its influence over the entire region. The town has European architecture and interesting historical places. The town center (Plaza de Armas) is known for the government buildings, the well-kept gardens, and the memorial to Ferdinand Magellan.

#### Puerto Williams

Puerto Williams is one of the world's southernmost towns and lies on the island of Navarino. Only the narrow Beagle Channel divides it from the Argentinian Tierra del Fuego, where high, snow covered peaks create a monumental background. The town was founded as a radio station in 1953 and was later developed into a naval base. About 2,400 people live here today.

#### The Magellan Strait

The Magellan Strait bears the name of the Portuguese seafarer who discovered this navigable sea route in 1520. The Magellan Strait separates the South American continent from Tierra del Fuego. The area is comprised of the strait itself, and all the channels and fjords around the Brunswick Peninsula. The Magellan Strait is of permanent significance for navigation between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans and for the maritime industry between Chile and Argentina.

#### Garibaldi Fjord

We sail through the Chilean fjords, and sail deep into the Garibaldi Fjord. The mountains are steep and even if there is snow on top of the mountains the area is very green with abundant wildlife. At the end of the fjord you'll see the beautiful Garibaldi glaciers calving ice into the fjord. Come ashore and maybe we will see sea lions, Andean condors, and several other birds only found here.

#### Cape Horn

Cape Horn is on the southernmost tip of South America, and it is still a maritime legend. It marks the northern boundary of the Drake Passage. The waters around the Cape are particularly hazardous, owing to strong winds, large waves, and strong currents. If the weather is favorable we will go ashore, and on most of the voyages we give ourselves two chances to do this, both on the southbound and northbound journey.

## FALKLAND ISLANDS

#### New Island

New Island is a tiny little island belonging to the Falkland Islands. It's beautiful with sandy white beaches and turquoise waters. Except for the temperature, it could easily be mistaken for a Caribbean island. On shore you can enjoy a day among penguins, seals, and elephant seals.

#### West Point Island

West Point Island, with its spectacular cliffs, lies off the northwest corner of West Falkland. It is home to over 2,000 pairs of black-browed albatross and about 500 pairs of rockhopper penguins. As well as the rich birdlife, the picturesque settlement and small harbor are often teeming with dolphins.

#### Stanley

Stanley, the capital of the Falklands, is a colorful seaside town that boasts many reminders of its British heritage, such as red phone booths and six distinctively-English pubs. Discover the town on your own, or join one of the several excursions we offer here.

## ANTARCTICA

#### King George Island

On King George Island we will visit a research station in Antarctica. The friendly Polish crew welcomes us, and let us explore the area. On the beaches there are hundreds of penguins and old whalebones from the whaling period, and you will see what is probably the only greenhouse in Antarctica. The Expedition Team offers hikes to see the penguins, kayaking, and a visit to the grave of the Polish wildlife photographer who died here in 1979.

#### Deception Island

Ring-shaped Deception Island is an incredible island! You should be on deck as we sail through the narrow channel at Neptune's Bellows, one of the only places in the world where we can sail directly into the center of a restless volcano. It is also home to many penguins.

#### Neko Harbour and Almirante Brown

Being in Antarctica's waters is one thing, but going ashore on the Antarctic mainland is rare. And today gives you the opportunity to do just that. Neko Harbour is truly a taste of Antarctic paradise. Several hundred gentoo penguins breed here, and often leopard seals are lurking in the waters. A huge glacier has its calving front just a few hundred feet from the stony landing site. We also visit Paradise Harbour and the Almirante Brown science station and

sail through the Lemaire channel for a closer look at glaciers, icebergs, and mountains.

#### Cuverville Island

Today is penguin day! We take our small-craft boats to make a landing. Penguins are also the theme-of-the-day on board, so get ready to be charmed and enjoy the day. Cuverville Island hosts the largest gentoo penguin colony in Antarctica with 6,500 breeding pairs. Come ashore to see these adorable creatures up close.

#### Half Moon Island

On Half Moon Island you will explore the impressive Antarctic scenery. From deck there are great opportunities to see whales. Coming ashore, you may see chinstrap penguins and fur seals up close. Join a hike up on one of the mountains. We will also put kayaks on the water.

#### Danco Island

Danco Island lies peacefully among the icebergs in the Errera Channel, just a few hundred feet from the Antarctic mainland. This small island is a breeding site for gentoo penguins. Join us ashore to look, enjoy kayaking to see the ice up close, or take a trip on our small boats.

### URUGUAY

#### Montevideo

Montevideo is Uruguay's capital and a modern metropolis with a historical center dating back to colonial times. The city boasts a picturesque blend of colonial Spanish, Italian, and Art Deco styles. Visit the Ciudad Vieja (Old Town) with its 18th century buildings, the vibrant Mercado del Puerto, the bustling Avenida 18 de Julio with its numerous theatres, museums, and art galleries, and the stretch of white, sandy beaches surrounding the city.

### Day 3: San Pedro de Atacama - Tulo and Quitor archeological sites

There is a morning departure toward the archeological site of Tulo - the oldest vestige and the first human settlement in the Atacama Salt Flat, which has been miraculously preserved. It is known as the 'Cradle of the Likan Antai culture' dating back 2,000 years. Next, visit Pukará de Quitor. This defensive stone fortress from the 12th century was attacked by the Spanish conquistador Francisco de Aguirre in 1540, restored in 1981, and declared a national monument in 1982. A tasting of typical regional foods will be served during the excursion. Return to San Pedro de Atacama and have the afternoon at your leisure. Dinner is on your own and overnight at hotel.

### Day 4: San Pedro de Atacama/Calama/Santiago - El Tatio Geysers

There is an early-morning excursion to the El Tatio Geysers, which is located at over 14,000 feet above sea level and approx. 55 miles from San Pedro de Atacama. The geothermal field has close links to the volcanic activity in the zone and consists of huge steam columns which reach heights of almost 40 feet. Intense sulphur odors and pools of boiling water and mud make this place an impressive and eerie site.

Watch for families of vicuñas, foxes, and Andean ostrich. We will stop at Puritama, famous for its hot pools, where the warm water flows through the rocks.

This is the perfect place to relax and enjoy the absolutely natural setting and waters that reach an average temperature of 33.5° C / 92.3° F. Return to your hotel and have lunch on your own before the afternoon transfer to Calama. There is a late afternoon flight from Calama back to Santiago de Chile. Transfer to your hotel. Dinner is on your own and overnight at hotel.
